What was this building for?

The Coliseum is in Italy, in Rome. It was built in 80 AD. It was **169** meters long and **156** meters wide. The arena was 83 meters by 48 meters. There was a **wooden** floor covered with sand. This huge theatre had four floors. There were underground tunnels for people and animals.




